### **About the York County, PA Quick Response Team**

The York County, Pennsylvania Quick Response Team (QRT) was formed in November 2002 to provide assistance to local law enforcement agencies in the management and resolution of special threats and high-risk incidents.

The tactical and negotiations teams are comprised of thirty five (35) law enforcement officers from various agencies, including York City, Springettsbury Township, York Area Regional, Spring Garden Township, Northeastern Regional, Newberry Township, Fairview Township, West Manchester Township, Northern York County Regional, Penn Township and the York County Sheriff's Office. These departments are united under mutual aid agreements to maximize available resources for response to incidents in a rapid and effective manner. Often, these types of response details can place a financial burden on the departments represented and/or the jurisdiction in which the call for assistance was initially generated.

The York County QRT participates in monthly training sessions to cover a variety of special threat and high-risk incidents including, but not limited to: dynamic entries into buildings; active school shooting situations; rescue of citizens utilizing an armored vehicle; hostage rescue; vehicle and bus assaults; and high risk warrant service.
